One of Britain's higgest charities covered up the use of prostitutes by senior aid workers in earthquake-toen

Oxfam, which receives £300 million a year in British government funds and ublic donations, allowed three men to resign and sacked four for gross misonduct after an inquiry into sexual exploitation, the downloading of pernography, bullying and intimidation.

A confidential report by the charity said that there had been "a culture of impunity" among some staff in Haiti



#### Human eggs grown in lab offer hope to infertile

Human eggs have been grown to maturity outside the body for the first time in a breakthrough for fertility

science.
Scientists at the University of Edinburgh announced that they had re-moved egg cells from women's ovarian tissue and developed them in a laboratory to the point where they were ready to be fertilised. The advance may one day be used as an alternative to IVF to help older women to conceive. It could also belp to preserve the fertility of girls undersoine cancer treatment

Evelyn Telfer, the senior scientist involved, said that the work was the culmination of 30 years of research to better understand the early stages of reproduction. Scientists can now study egg development in the laboratory.

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#### What happened?

- 2011: Six Oxfam staff members in Haiti leave the charity after being found guilty of misconduct.
- 2017: Charity Commission contacts Oxfam after being alerted it sacked former country director for Nigeria, after she made allegations of sexual by a colleague.
- 2018: Penny Mordaunt, international development secretary says government funding 'not guaranteed'.

Haiti's government stops Oxfam GB from working in the country.

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#### What was the impact on fundraising?

- 7,000 regular givers cancelled direct debits
- Regular giving fell from £52.2m in 2018 to £47m in 2019
- Income from government, institutional donors and other public authorities fell from £209.3m to £185.9m
- UK government reduced its funding to Oxfam from £21.7m to £18.8M
- Celebrities withdrew their support
- Job losses 111 roles made redundant
- Forced it to scale back its operations



"Underlying income, which is derived principally from Oxfam GB's public fundraising and trading operations as well as from a variety of governmental and institutional donors, was and continues to be adversely affected following revelations of the safeguarding issues in Haiti..."

35% said they were less likely to donate to humanitarian charities in the future,

**52%** of existing donors said they would now be less likely to fund humanitarian causes.



### What are we required to do?



"Protecting people and safeguarding should be a governance priority for all charities, regardless of size, type or income, not just those working with children or groups traditionally considered at risk. It is essential for trustees to take reasonable steps to safeguard beneficiaries from abuse."

### 1. Policy, procedures, codes of conduct

- A safeguarding policy is an essential document
- Policies and procedures should reflect the nature of the activities of your organisation
- Codes of Conduct set out the way everyone should work and behave in their role



### 2. Training

- Equipping
- Teamwork
- Time to talk and debrief





#### 3. Safer Recruitment





### 4. Management of Workers

- Training
- Teamwork
- Time to talk and debrief





#### 5. Working Safely

- Risk assessing activities
- Health and Safety
- Insurance
- Regular monitoring (self-audit)
- Risk register to include safeguarding



## 6. Communicating Effectively

- Communications available in different formats
- Complaints procedure
- Service user involvement
- Appropriate confidentiality



### 7. Responding to Concerns

- Recognising possible indicators of abuse
- Robust initial response
- Record keeping
- Knowing when to involve statutory authorities



#### 8. Pastoral Care

Ensuring support is available to all those affected by abuse



### 9. Working with those who may pose a risk

- Proportionate risk assessment and appropriate measures to manage risks
- Supervision contract
- Designated monitoring and support team
- Liaison with outside agencies if appropriate



### 10. Working in Partnership

- Ensuring beneficiaries are suitable (due diligence)
- Complexities of international context
- Reporting serious incidents to the Charity Commission
